Introduction: In today's culture, anyone who claims that his religion is "superior" to any other religion in the world is immediately deemed to be intolerant at best and a hate-monger at worst. Yet, the author of the book of Hebrews argues that understanding the superiority of Christianity to every other belief system is essential to embracing and sharing Christ's offer of salvation.

Hebrews 8:1, 6 ¹ "Now the main point in what has been said is this: we have such a high priest, who has taken His seat at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens, ⁶ but now He has obtained a more excellent ministry, by as much as He is also the mediator of a better covenant, which has been enacted on better promises."

1 Corinthians 3:1-3 ¹ "And I, brethren, could not speak to you as to spiritual men, but as to men of flesh, as to babes in Christ. ² I gave you milk to drink, not solid food; for you were not yet able to receive it. Hebrews 1:1-2 ¹ "God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways, ² in these last days has spoken to us in His Son, whom He appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the world."

Hebrews 1:5-6 $\,^{5}$ "For to which of the angels did He ever say, 'Thou art My Son, today I have BEGOTTEN THEE'? And again, 'I WILL BE A FATHER TO HIM, AND HE SHALL BE A SON TO ME'? $\,^{6}$ And when He again brings the first-born into the world, He says, 'AND LET ALL THE ANGELS OF GOD WORSHIP HIM.'"

C. Christ is Superior to Moses (Hebrews 3:1-6)

Hebrews 3:5-6 ⁵ "Now Moses was faithful in all His house as a servant, for a testimony of those things which were to be spoken later; ⁶ but Christ was faithful as a Son over His house whose house we are, if we hold fast our confidence and the boast of our hope firm until the end."

WARNING: Do Not Harden Your Hearts! (Hebrews 3:7-4:16)

Hebrews 3:7-12 ⁷ "Therefore, just as the Holy Spirit says, 'TODAY IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE, ⁸ DO NOT HARDEN YOUR HEARTS AS WHEN THEY PROVOKED ME, AS IN THE DAY OF TRIAL IN THE WILDERNESS, ⁹ WHERE YOUR FATHERS TRIED ME BY TESTING ME, AND SAW MY WORKS FOR FORTY YEARS. ¹⁰ THEREFORE I WAS ANGRY WITH THIS GENERATION, AND SAID, "THEY ALWAYS GO ASTRAY IN THEIR HEART; AND THEY DID NOT KNOW MY WAYS; ¹¹ AS I SWORE IN MY WRATH, THEY SHALL NOT ENTER MY REST." ¹² Take care, brethren, lest there should be in any one of you an evil, unbelieving heart, in falling away from the living God.""

D. Christ is Superior to the <u>Levitical Priesthood</u> (Hebrews 5:1-10:39)

Hebrews 10:1-4 ¹ "For the Law, since it has only a shadow of the good things to come and not the very form of things, can never by the same sacrifices year by year, which they offer continually, make perfect those who draw near. ² Otherwise, would they not have ceased to be offered, because the worshipers, having once been cleansed, would no longer have had consciousness of sins? ³ But in those sacrifices there is a reminder of sins year by year. ⁴ For it is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins."

E. Christ is a Superior Object of Our <u>Faith</u> (Hebrews 11:1-13:19)

Hebrews 12:1-2 ¹ "Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance, and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with the endurance the race that is set before us, ² fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God."

Hebrews 6:4-6 ⁴ "For in the case of those who have once been enlightened and have tasted of the heavenly gift and have been made partakers of the Holy Spirit, ⁵ and have tasted the good word of God and the powers of the age to come, ⁶ and then have fallen away, it is impossible to renew them again to repentance, since they again crucify to themselves the Son of God, and put Him to open shame."
